BRUSSELS NATIONAL AIRPORT (brusselsairport.be/en)

Railway station is located under the airport

- There is 1 direct train to Bruges/hour. Alternatively, first take the train to Brussels 'Zuid / Midi' station. From Brussels 'Zuid / Midi', take a train in the direction of Brugge, De Panne, Knokke, Blankenberge or Oostende.
- 3 connections per hour / about 90 minutes / € 21,30
- First train at 05:26, last train at 23:59 (on Sat and Sun at 05:31 and 23:52)
- Cheaper fare possible with Go-Pass One ticket (see next page), a Diabolo surtax of €5.25 will be added

BRUSSELS SOUTH CHARLEROI AIRPORT (charleroi-airport.com)

Small lowcost airport 50 km outside of Brussels, in Charleroi. There is a bus that goes straight to Bruges from Charleroi airport. If you have a delay and have no more connection, a taxi to Bruges costs €190.

Shuttle bus to Bruges: Flibco

- schedule varies (flibco.com); duration is 2 hours and 10 minutes to Bruges.
- one-way starting from € 5 to € 15.

=> some Eurolines buses stop in Bruges (West Station Sint-Michiels stop), but most international buses only stop in Brussels.

Eurolines stops at Brussels 'Noord / Nord' station, Flixbus stops near Brussels 'Noord / Nord' & 'Zuid / Midi' station, Ouibus stops at Brussels 'Zuid / Midi' station. It will be no problem to catch a train from Brussels to Bruges, but watch out: buses often have a delay, so you might have to spend the night in Brussels if you're late.

=> international trains to and from Belgium. International trains don't stop in Bruges, only in Brussels 'Zuid / Midi' station.

Eurostar = international high-speed train between the UK, France and Belgium.

Thalys = international high-speed train between France, Belgium and the Netherlands.

Izy = lowcost Thalys, trains between Paris and Brussels.

TRAINS IN BELGIUM (belgianrail.be)

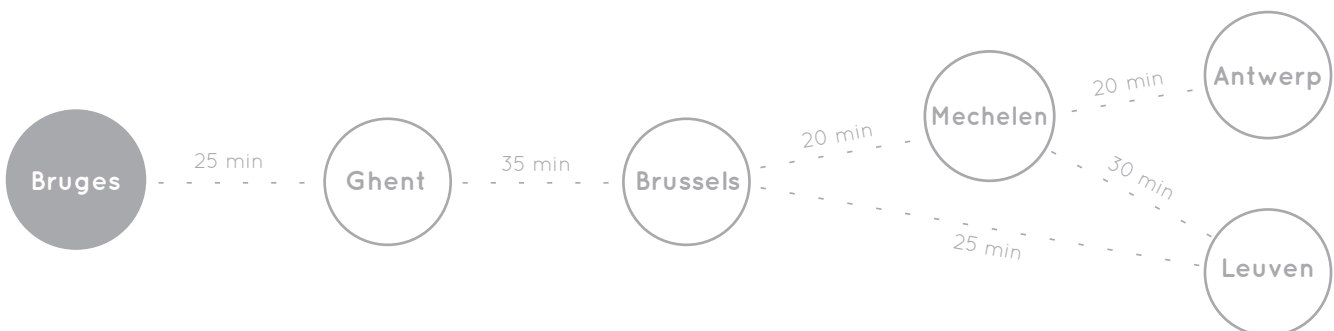
TIP: Travelling with friends

- 25 or younger Go-Pass (10 rides for €52)
- older than 25 Rail Pass (10 rides for €77)

Both passes can be used between all Belgian stations with more than 1 person at the same time.

Tip: Travelling alone

- one-way trips Go-Pass One (one-way ticket to anywhere in Belgium for €6.20)
* only -26 years old. Buy from ticketing machines in stations or print at home
* always check whether or not the standard ticket isn't cheaper
- return trips Weekend ticket (usually almost half the price of regular ones)
* only during weekends, from Fridaynight (7PM) onwards



Train from Brussels to Bruges = €14,70. There are 3 stations in Brussels: 'Zuid/ Midi', 'Central' and 'Noord / Nord'. All Belgian trains stop in these three stations, so you can choose. Brussels 'Zuid / Midi' is closest to Bruges.

IC-trains (InterCity) go faster than IR-trains (Inter-Regional). Don't take slow L-trains (local).
